Dear Parents,

That joy comes from recognition—the comfort of the familiar. The more music they know, the more likely they feel connected and excited about learning new pieces. Unfortunately, if they're only familiar with a few songs, everything else seems foreign and less engaging.


Beyond Playing Notes: Have you ever noticed how some musicians bring any piece to life, regardless of its difficulty? That's musicality. It's not just about hitting the right notes; it's about feeling and understanding the music. Sadly, some students are still musically disconnected after years of lessons.

Rhythm Struggles: Many students struggle with rhythm. Even with regular practice, they might only get better at the piece they're working on, not necessarily building the rhythm skills they need for other music. This often happens because there isn't enough daily music in their lives. Soaking up music at home daily can help make sense of those tricky rhythms.

Create a musical environment at home:

- Listen to music whenever you can, aim for 1 hour a day
- Clap, Sing, and Dance to the music in various styles or genres
- Go to live concerts, talk about feelings
- Explore books, videos, movies, and apps to foster a love for music.



Since instrument teachers only see students once a week for a 30-minute session, they cannot provide the continual musical environment necessary for this level of immersion. Only YOU can provide the essential daily musical environment that nurtures your child's love and understanding of music.


